## **Meet Our Panelists**



MARK HYMAN, Moderator, George Solomon Endowed Chair in Sports Journalism, Merrill College of Journalism, University of Maryland, directs the college's Shirley Povich Center for Sports Journalism; teaches sports journalism classes; Hyman spent four decades as a sports journalist at Businessweek, The Baltimore Sun, The Baltimore News American, Dallas Times Herald, The Bulletin (Philadelphia) and The Ledger-Star (Norfolk, Virginia); former Professor of Sport Management, The George Washington University School of Business; winner of Associated Press Sports Editors Awards for investigative reporting and news writing.



**Post**, He covers national college sports with a focus on business and the future of the industry. He previously covered the Washington Nationals for five years and authored a book on the team's 2019 title: Buzz Saw: The Improbable Story of How the Washington Nationals Won the World Series. Prior to joining the Post in 2017, Dougherty covered the NHL and NBA, among other sports, for the Los Angeles Times. He recently launched What's Up With College Sports, a Substack newsletter, which will complement his work at the Post. Jesse is a Syracuse University graduate and grew up near Philadelphia.



**NAILA-JEAN MEYERS, Deputy Sports Editor,** *The Minnesota Star Tribune.* She oversees coverage of the Vikings and the Olympics and the department's digital and audience strategy. She joined the *Minnesota Star Tribune* in 2020 after 15 years as an editor in the sports department at The *New York Times* where she covered everything from Grand Slam tennis tournaments to Super Bowls. She also previously worked at the *St. Louis Post-Dispatch* and the *Sporting News*. She is a past president of Associated Press Sports Editors (APSE). She grew up in Ames, Iowa, and is a graduate of Northwestern University.



**LISA BELL WILSON, Editorial Director, Talent and Development,** *The Athletic.* Wilson is also the Executive Director of the APSE Foundation which supports the APPSE Diversity in Leadership Fellowship. She previously served as the NFL editor at *The Athletic* and, previous to that post, as the senior editor for sports at ESPN's *The Undefeated.* In 2020, Wilson became the Associated Press Sports Editors (APSE) first Black female president in the organization's then 46-year history. Previous to her ESPN stint, Wilson spent over 18 years at *The Buffalo News*, including the last six as Executive Sports Editor, at a time during which she was the only Black woman leading a sports section at a USA metropolitan daily newspaper. Prior to *The News*, she was sport reporter, feature editor, and sports editor at the *Niagara Gazette*.
